**Celebration of Mass with the Ordination of Bishops
for Bishops-elect John J. McIntyre and Michael J. Fitzgerald**

The *Rites of Ordination* of a Bishop instructs the priests and people of the local church to pray during the Prayer of the Faithful at Mass and the Intercessions of Vespers for the Bishop(s)-elect (cf. RO, 15). Please consider adding the following petition at liturgical celebrations on August 6.

For Bishops-elect John McIntyre and Michael Fitzgerald
who will soon serve as assistant Bishops to Cardinal Rigali,
that they will be constant and faithful in preaching the Gospel of Christ
and building up the Body of Christ among us
in union with all their brother Bishops.
Let us pray to the Lord.

MASS FOR THE OPENING OF THE ACADEMIC YEAR

A votive *Mass of the Holy Spirit* may be scheduled for the opening of the academic year on weekdays when there is no liturgical impediment. The *Sacramentary* provides three options for this Votive Mass. One of the prefaces of the Holy Spirit is used and red vestments are worn. The *Lectionary* texts for the day are preferable.
