SOME LITURGICAL CALENDAR ITEMS

SOLEMNITY OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY, MOTHER OF GOD Saturday, 1 January 2011

The Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, since it falls on a Saturday this year, is not observed as a Holy Day of Obligation. Nonetheless, the faithful should be encouraged to participate in the scheduled Masses, celebrated in a festive manner.

FEAST OF SAINT JOHN NEUMANN

Wednesday, 5 January 2011

The Feast of Saint John Neumann enjoys the rank of a *feast* in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia for both the celebration of Mass and the Divine Office.

WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY

Tuesday, 18 January through Tuesday, 25 January 2011

The week of prayer for Christian Unity calls for petitions in the Prayer of the Faithful for this intention. Also, when possible the Mass for the Unity of Christians may be used with the readings of the day and green vestments.

DAY OF PENANCE AND PRAYER Saturday, 22 January 2011

In November 2001, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops approved several adaptations to the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*. Following confirmation by the Holy See in February 2002, and the publication of the third edition of the *Missale Romanum* with the *Institutio generalis* itself in April 2002, the US adaptations became particular law for the dioceses of the United States of America, including:

In all the dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when the 22^{nd} falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of <u>penance</u> for the violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion, and of <u>prayer</u> for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life. The

Mass "For Peace and Justice" (no. 22 from "Masses for Various Needs") should be celebrated with violet vestments as an appropriate liturgical observance of this day.

COLDS AND FLU AND THE CELEBRATION OF THE SACRED LITURGY

- Ministers of Holy Communion should wash their hands before Mass begins, or even use an alcohol based anti-bacterial solution in the pew before distributing, and after purifying their fingers after distributing Holy Communion;
- People feeling ill should avoid receiving Communion from the chalice.

Priests are encouraged to use good pastoral common sense to allay the fears of the faithful during cold and flu season. An example of this might include refraining from the use of the Sign of Peace during the celebration of Mass and reminding the faithful not to receive the Precious Blood if they are ill.

PARISH BASED CATECHESIS FOR THE ARCHDIOCESE OF PHILADELPHIA

The Office for Worship has produced a parish based catechesis for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia for the reception of the *Roman Missal* for use beginning Advent 2010 through Advent 2011. This catechesis is called: *Know the Words, Know the Meaning, Know the Mystery.* It is designed for a great variety of uses in the parish and for a great variety of parish groups. It can be downloaded and inserted into parish bulletins, printed for discussion and reflection, and provide content for school and religious education classes.
